- Meeting with CalHR annually for the last fourteen years to discuss our pay raises and other supervisory issues. As a member of your Supervisory Meet & Confer team, I have been involved in negotiations for you with three administrations: Governors Davis, Schwarzenegger, and Brown.
- Participating on PECG's nominating committee since 2010. During this time, I have worked to make sure PECG members have a slate of corporate candidates that will best represent the membership
- Providing testimony at the CalHR (then known as the Department of Personnel Administration) salary grievance hearings regarding the pay equity raises that supervisors did not receive for six years.

Most of us are integral parts of world-class agencies and we must do our part to keep the organizations that way. It is why I have been proud to be a public servant for nearly two decades while representing you in our interactions with CalHR and the legislature. It is why I would like to continue to represent you as your President Elect so we can continue to work together to fulfill PECG's goals.

Our current contract runs through June 30, 2018. We started the bargaining process in mid-March and have been meeting with CalHR every other week since then.

The State economy and the budget continues its steady growth. In fact California has moved up to being the 5th largest economy in the world and there is an \$8.8 billion state budget surplus, both facts should work in our favor.

Most of the other bargaining units opted for an MOU term that goes into the next Administration - there are only three other units bargaining in 2018 - the California Highway Patrol Officers, the Prison Guards and the State Scientists. CCPOA (prison guards) recently reached an agreement with the state.

One area where we have not seen much change is in our annual salary survey comparing the salaries of PECG members to their counterparts in local agencies. The results of salary surveys performed the last couple years are only showing marginal increases. However, a number of local agencies are providing raises to their engineers and related professionals in the next couple years.

As always, PECG leadership and staff continue to excel by consistently bringing our issues forward and positioning the organization so that when opportunities come up, we can take advantage of them. This was the case in 2003 when we entered into the MOU that gave us the pay parity raises and two years ago in 2015 when we executed our current MOU.

And whatever the outcome of the upcoming corporate elections, as a PECG volunteer and member of the Bargaining Team, I will continue to work hard to represent PECG's membership.
