Re: CalHR Policy Update - Increase to Meal and Short-Term Lodging Expense Reimbursement Rates and new Business and Travel Expense Reimbursement Program - Excluded Employees

Dear Labor Leaders,

The State is implementing increases to the meal expense reimbursement rates within the existing business and travel reimbursement policy (<u>CalHR Manual Section 2203</u>). Effective January 1, 2024, for all excluded employees on authorized travel status, the reimbursement rates for actual meal and incidental expenses (M&IE) will be as follows:

M&IE Expense Category	Current Reimbursement Rate Through December 31, 2023 for Actual Expense - Excluded Employees	Effective January 1, 2024: Reimbursement Rate for Actual Expense - Excluded Employees
Breakfast	Up to \$7	Up to \$13
Lunch	Up to \$11	Up to \$15
Dinner	Up to \$23	Up to \$26
Incidentals	Up to \$5	Up to \$5
Total Daily Maximum Allowance	Up to \$46	Up to \$59

In addition, effective January 1, 2024, the State is implementing increases to the shortterm lodging reimbursement rates within the existing business and travel reimbursement policy (<u>CalHR Manual Section 2203</u>). For all excluded employees on authorized travel status, the maximum short-term lodging reimbursement rates for receipted lodging expenses will be as follows:

The State is in the planning process to implement additional elements of the new business and travel expense reimbursement program that include adopting the federal standard M&IE and lodging rates established by the federal General Services Administration (GSA). This new program shall also include:

- Adopting the federal standard M&IE rate established by the GSA at time of travel for in-state and out-of-state travel;
- Adopting federal standard and non-standard reimbursement rates at time of travel for in-state, out-of-state, and out-of-country lodging;
- Simplifying current reimbursement policy and administration and providing up to 75 percent (75%) of the federal standard rate established by the GSA for M&IE on the first and last day of travel;
- Eliminating the state's long-term travel reimbursement rates and adopting the federal standard M&IE reimbursement rates for long-term meals, and receipted lodging shall be reimbursed up to the maximum federal standard and non-standard reimbursement rates.

It is anticipated the new business and travel expense reimbursement program, as summarized above, will be implemented in 2024. More information and details will be provided once a firm implementation date has been determined.
