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PECG Updates

General Salary Increase

As reported in previous <u>Weekly Updates</u>, the State has issued multiple pay letters to provide the 2.5% General Salary Increase (GSI) to all Unit 9 members – rank and file employees and supervisors and managers – effective July 1, 2022, and to implement the many new and improved pay differentials that are part of PECG's 2022-25 Memorandum of Understanding (MOU).

The vast majority of PECG members report having received the GSI and the related back pay. Unfortunately, we continue to hear from members that have yet to receive the differential increases and the associated back pay.



If you have yet to receive your GSI, a differential increase, or the back pay associated with them – please notify your Personnel Specialist immediately. Please also share your circumstance with PECG by emailing us at pecg.org. We continue to follow up with departments to urge that they take the necessary steps to ensure that Unit 9 employees receive the pay increases they are due as soon as is possible.

Water Resources – Transitional Kindergarten

PECG Member Marilyn Petruescu recently visited the transitional kindergarten (TK) class at Saint John Vianney School in Rancho Cordova. Marilyn visited during a week when the school recognized various vocations and shared the importance of keeping water resources clean and useable with the students. The presentation included a demonstration with water bottles filled with clean water and old cooking oil. The children were able to shake them up, watch the oil separate, and make observations about something "yucky" in the water. Next, they read a book titled "What Does It Mean to Be



Green?" by Rana DiOrio which gave age-appropriate explanations and suggestions for conserving resources (i.e. color on both sides of a paper). Finally, the children enjoyed the last "experiment" of colored water being drawn up into celery stalks. The colored water represented water with various "yucky" components (and favorite colors) and the celery represented clean happy plants. The children predicted what the celery might do if it drank this water and then they were presented with celery that had been left for 24 hours. They learned that the quality of water that plants and people are exposed to can effect health and it's a good idea to keep it clean! At the end of the activity, the children were given PECG notepads and pens which they used to document their understanding of the experiment and draw their own flowers and plants enduring various kinds of

water. The two classroom teachers were presented with PECG tumblers to remember our outreach. Classroom visits are a fun way to share the role of engineers in state service.
